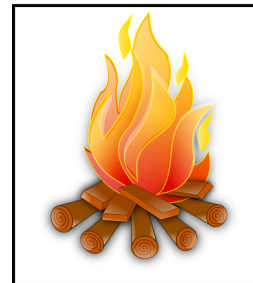
Area 42 Delegate
