The Finance Committee met on November 9th to go over the Budget proposal for 2017.

The Budget Proposal and the Addendum will explain how we arrived at all the proposed figures. Once we are able to plug in the correct figures for the standing committees, I will ask Glenn to email the corrected Budget Proposal to all DCMs. At least you have some information to take back to your groups.

We have increased some expenditure line items, while decreasing projected income. Even though we still have two more months of income to post, we probably will not hit our 2016 budget projections. I anticipate that we will probably end up with Contributions income of about \$9,200. plus 7th Tradition income of about \$550.00, leaving a shortfall of \$1,150.00. Thus we have adjusted the projected 2017 income to only \$9600.00.

We have decreased projected expenses for 2017 by approximately \$1198.00 mainly due to the one-time PRAASA travel expense and our new SAGSC Chair being fully funded for travel by the Area. There will probably be an additional decrease to expenditures once we receive the Standing Committee figures from Central Office.

Along with the Budget, we have included an Addendum which explains the breakdown of amounts requested.

Again, we are presenting a negative budget which is mainly due to decrease in the amounts being received in the 7th Tradition and the increase in expenses overall.

In January, we will need to vote on the Delegate Expenses, plus vote on each Committee and Travel expense line item separately.

I trust the Budget and Addendum are clear enough for you to take to your groups to guide your January voting.

Two years ago our alternate area chair Justin appointed me as Grapevine chair. I am very grateful that he thought of me for this position. It has been an amazing and rewarding service position. I got to meet a bunch of new people and go to a bunch of service events. This rotation it was our alternate delegate Rhonda's duty to appoint the Grapevine chair and she appointed Justin. I think that is super cool and I know that Justin will do a great job serving us as the new Grapevine chair. He has already come to a few of our meetings and I will be hanging around to help make the transition as smooth as possible.

GSR Trainer
Proposal

Objective: To provide funding for the SAGSC (Southern Area General Service Committee) GSR Survival Trainer to attend the Fall and Spring Area Assemblies (funds permitting) and a budget for literature used for their trainings. To have the position be an appointed position by the SAGSC Chair for a two year rotation term.
