Message from our Delegate

Yo yo yo!! What up area 42? Can you believe we are already a quarter of the way through with our panel 73 rotation? My sobriety date is 8/16/2006. I remember when I first became a GSR and found out it was a two year commitment! I couldn't believe it. Two years seemed like an eternity. The longer I stay sober the more I realize what an absolute miracle it is that I ever got sober. What a miracle it is that I became a member of this fellowship and was able to finally be beaten down enough to take some direction.

I will never know how I got 30 days of sobriety. What I do know is that once I ran out of my own ideas and was desperate enough to ask for help, I started calling rehabs. After calling every facility in my area, I then called my brother, who told me I should simply try going to the church on Greenway and Horizon, the next night, at 7pm, and that I will find people there that can

help, which I did! At first, I hated everything about AA and everything about being sober. But there were people there that saved my life. They held my hand and gave me a new way to live. They put me into service when I was 2 months sober and I have had a service position in AA ever since.

I am so grateful for everything AA has done for me. AA has never asked anything from me, except that when I get this, try to pass it onto the next person who walks in the door. I pray that I can do that until the day I die. Our Area Assembly is coming up quickly in beautiful downtown Tonopah, Nevada. I hope to see all of you there or on our virtual platform. Thank you very much for your service and for making Area 42 the greatest Area in the history of the universe!!!

Nevada Area 42 inventory

At our Spring Assembly, a request was made that Area 42 conduct a group inventory. With support from the members present, an ad hoc committee was formed to coordinate a process to be used at our Fall Assembly to implement the inventory. The ad hoc committee asked our membership for suggestions of inventory questions. The following is the result. These questions will be discussed at our next Assembly. GSRs, please share with your groups and bring your group’s conscience to share at our Fall Assembly.

From the Inventory Ad Hoc Committee

The following questions have been selected by the Area Inventory Ad Hoc committee to present to the Fall Area Assembly in September, 2023. The Ad Hoc Committee is recommending the Assembly pick 3 or 4 topics to discuss. We will then offer the opportunity for people to express their opinions on any question(s). We are estimating between 20 to 30 minutes per topic depending on the number of topics selected. Each person will have 3 minutes to speak. ***We suggest GSRs should bring the full list of questions to their groups to get their feedback.***

TOPIC 1 - GSRs

- What can the area and the districts do to inspire GSRs to get in and keep them involved in general service?
- Are we giving too many reports and if so, how could we replace time spent giving reports with other relevant information?
- Should we assign DCM, GSRs & Alt GSRs to a standing committee (rather than let them pick) to better mirror the General Service Conference. Why or why not?
- What would be more ways to prepare the GSR's for their position in addition to using the GSR Survival Manual and orientation at the Assembly.

TOPIC 2 - CONFERENCE AGENDA ITEMS

- Are there other ways to better educate/inform our delegate on agenda items?
- Have we, as an Area, made sure that our Delegate is truly informed by what our group consciences are or are we relying more on individual's experience/comments/opinions?
- How could we improve our agenda item education for the groups, GSRs and DCMs?

TOPIC 3 - REMOTE COMMUNITIES & DARK DISTRICTS

- How can we better serve and engage our remote communities within the cities, like Native American, Spanish-speaking, Asian, Black, Muslim, etc.?
- How do we encourage AA members in the larger cities and towns to make the effort to travel to remote meetings?
- Who's missing from our rooms? Why? What is our part in their absence?
- How can we improve on reaching out to dark & dim districts?

TOPIC 4 – TRANSLATION & INTERPRETATION

- Are the translation/interpretation committee special workers or trusted servants?
- Should we be paying for professional verbal and written translation services?
- Regarding translation and interpretation what are we doing well?
- Regarding translation and interpretation what can be improved?

TOPIC 5 - ASSEMBLY

- Why do we do new business on Sunday mornings when people are leaving or have left?
- How can we improve the assembly agenda?
- Do we still need the blue room?
- Should anyone be able to attend the blue room as an observer?

TOPIC 6 - AREA OFFICERS

- Are we asking too much of our Area officers, remembering we are volunteers?
- Is the workload and/or time needed for some area positions discouraging people from wanting to stand?
- Are we using our alternate officers effectively?
- In electing our trusted servants are we using Concept IX as a guide or just choosing warm bodies or the “cool kids”?

TOPIC 7 - STANDING COMMITTEES

- Are we asking the Accessibility Committee to cover too many special groups?
- Do we have too many committees? Not enough? Just right?
- What are some ideas to get more members involved in committee work?
- How can we improve our standing committees?

TOPIC 8 - FINANCES

- How would you like to see 7th Tradition contributions spent?
- Are we keeping too much money year-to-year?
- Would more funding for standing committees encourage more participation?

TOPIC 9 - AREA INVENTORY (This question is mandatory)

- What do you want to see be a result of this inventory?
- What are you willing to do to help to make that happen?

My name is Dano B., and I am an alcoholic. I was born and raised in New Jersey and have lived in Alaska and northern California.

I got sober in Las Vegas. It seemed like it was against my own will, but I persevered. I had the opportunity and availability of almost 1000 meetings per week in the Las Vegas Valley. I was a member of the Midnight meeting at the Serenity Club in Chinatown and would meet my sponsor at the Friday night Survivors Group at the Samaritan House in downtown Las Vegas. The expanse of my Area 42 was the small nucleus of the Las Vegas metropolitan area. I considered a summer drive to Boulder City an outward adventure!

I knew nothing about remote communities or small-town A.A. I knew nothing about Winnemucca, or Baker, Nevada, or the small sliver of eastern California that shares our Area 42 with Nevada. I never realized how the Spanish linguistics community was right beside my doorstep, or that the Native American populations call this their home. Our area covers a lot of geographic terrain. It also covers a larger spectrum of small towns and localized A.A. that, by living in the largest city in the state, I was just not familiar with.

I am overwhelmed by the amount of Twelve Step work available in the nooks and crannies of our area and how my small mind has expanded in this recovery program. Even more amazing is my increased understanding of the needs in our area over these years. How a small town like Beatty lies between northern and southern Nevada, that one lone member in Battle Mountain is reaching for the hand of A.A., and how an A.S.L. speaker yearns for the voice of A.A.

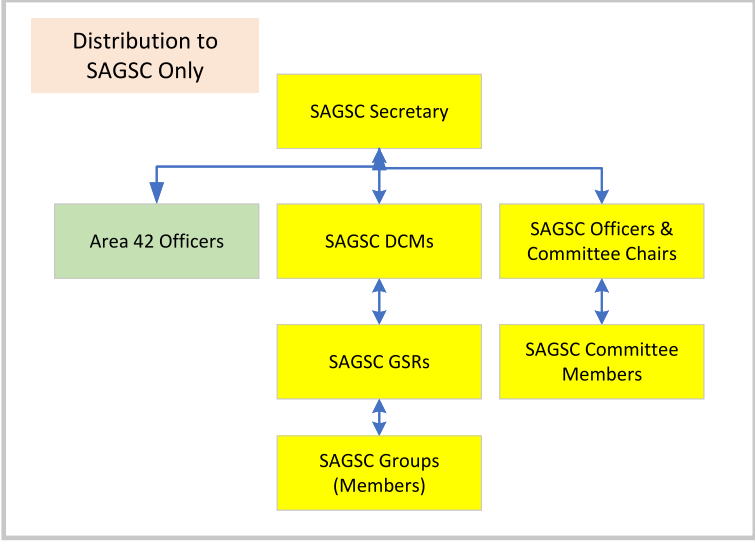
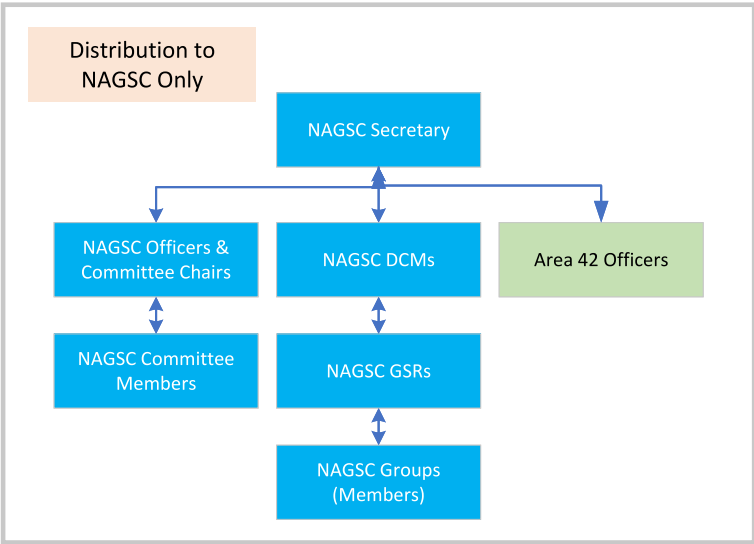
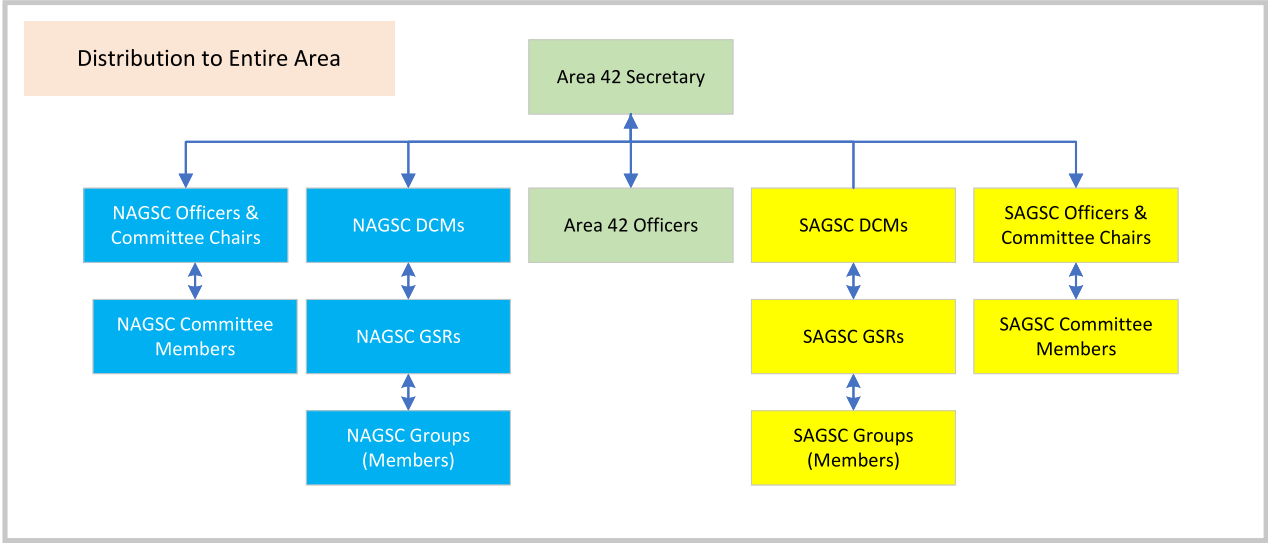
My own truth and irony are that I would rather drive 300 miles to have an A.A. meeting with a lone member than my apprehension to log into a Zoom meeting. I want the hand of A.A. always to be there. That hand needs to be connected to the arm and body as well. All my good thoughts and ideas do not help the sick and suffering alcoholic. Rather, it's the actions I take to include those who are not in the breadbasket of

activity. We have all types of A.A. members. Some who seem unreachable or uninterested in our program, those who rely on the telephone and mailbox to practice the program, and the ones who interpret the message.

Our Area 42 reflects our world. My growth in Alcoholics Anonymous has to be based on the idea that this program can work for anyone who desires its gifts. The next hundred years will be based on people who cannot access or have never heard the message of Alcoholics Anonymous, and for that.....I am responsible!

The Area 42 Communications Committee developed the flow chart below to illustrate how documents move through our communications channels. One of the main purposes of the General Service structure is to provide a communication path between the groups and the General Service Office. The charts below demonstrate to our members how emails and mail move between our groups and the Area, NAGSC, and SAGCS recording secretaries.

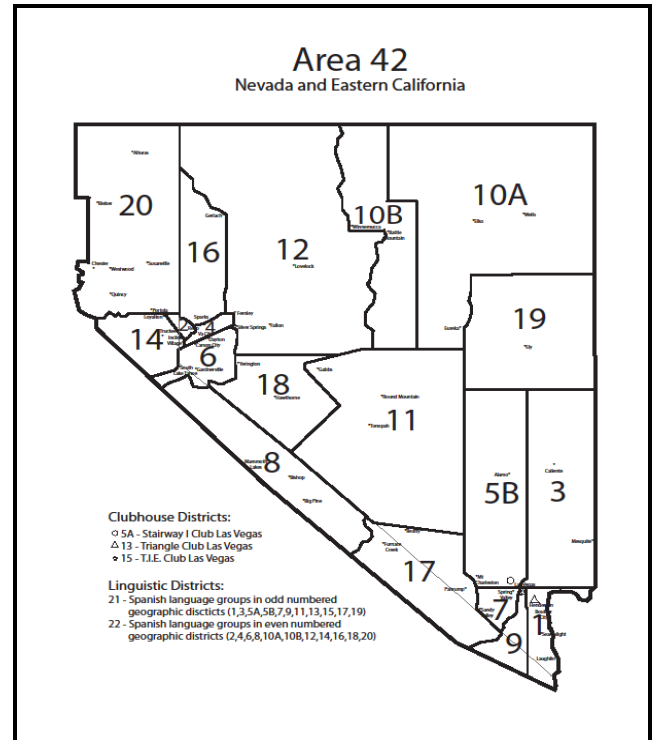

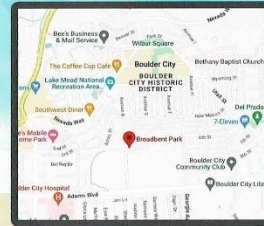

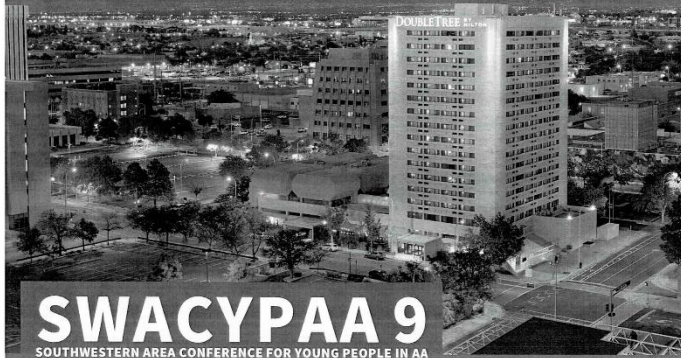
