





Area 42 Fall Hybrid Assembly

September 10th - 12th, 2021

Pre-registration will end on **August 23rd, 2021** you can register to attend "in-person" or "virtually" on-line. It is not a requirement to pre-register if you plan on attending in-person. But it will greatly help us out with the planning stages if you do, so we are urging you to please pre-register if possible. If you plan on attending virtually (on-line) you must pre-register before the end date. If you don't you will have to show up in-person and register on-site. Everyone will have to register whether you are planning on attending virtually or in-person and those planning on using one device for multiple users each of you will have to register.

We are also pre-selling Saturday night banquet tickets, these are **optional** but if you would like to eat at the banquet you may want to pre-purchase that at the same time as you get your registration. There will only be **120** banquet tickets available, this is 25% less than in the past because of too many unknown factors. You will still be able to attend the Saturday night speaker meeting even if you don't eat at the Banquet.

The Area absorbs the fees involved for the registration tickets, but the fees for the banquet tickets are up to you. This is the same process as in the past. Please fill out the registration form completely. When you get to the part to put in your information it will state "Ticket 1 Registration" and if you purchase a banquet ticket it will state "Ticket 2 Banquet" both have to be filled out. If you click on the box for "Ticket 2 Banquet" it will bring up a drop down menu and will have a choice of "Ticket 1 Registration" if you click on that it will auto fill the "Ticket 2"

<u>Corrections Correspondence</u> Service Motion

Submitted by Northern Area General Service Committee

This requests that the General Service Conference consider developing a pamphlet on the Corrections Correspondence Service to include current and additional Fellowship sharing on the value of Corrections Correspondence Service participation.

Background

This motion was originated by a member of the Caring & Sharing Group in Stead, NV. The motion received unanimous approval by the Caring & Sharing Group. The motion was then presented to the District 16 General Service Committee where the motion also received unanimous approval. The motion was presented to the Northern Area General Service Committee, (NAGSC), as new business on December 5, 2020. The motion was approved by majority by the NAGSC on June 5, 2021.

Sometimes upon incarceration, a still suffering alcoholic develops a desire to stop drinking. In some cases the person in custody may be confined in an institution that has no A.A. meetings, and sometimes no A.A literature. If that suffering person in custody contacts our General Service Office, one of the resources we can offer is the Corrections Correspondence Service.

The Corrections Correspondence Service, (CCS), allows an A.A. member who is not confined in a correctional facility to share recovery experience, strength, and hope with an alcoholic who is confined through written correspondence. This service is coordinated through the Corrections Desk at the General Service Office. The service is made possible by Fellowship members who volunteer to be Corrections Correspondents.

CCS was established by Conference Advisory Action in 1971. Forty-nine years later Corrections Correspondence is still referred to as "A Very Rewarding, But Rarely Mentioned Form Of 12th Step Work".

When this service is requested by an incarcerated alcoholic an "outside" Corrections Correspondent can serve as a vital link to the A.A. program of recovery.

"Our Twelfth Step- carrying the message- is the basic service that the A.A. Fellowship gives; this is our principal aim and the main reason for our existence."

A.A.'s Legacy of Service by Bill W. (1951)

The staff on the A.A. Corrections Desk continually describes the Corrections Correspondence Service as "one of our most valuable efforts". ¹

In an average year during the 2010-2019 period, the GSO Corrections Desk connected 1,439 persons in custody who requested this service with "outside" A.A. Corrections Correspondents. 73% of persons in custody requesting the service were male.²

There is an ongoing shortage of Fellowship volunteers, (particularly men), to serve as corrections correspondents.³ When a shortage of volunteers occurs, persons in custody requesting an outside correspondent are put on a waiting list until additional volunteers are enrolled in the service. Sometimes persons in custody wait for up to six months to be connected to an outside correspondent due to this shortage of volunteers.

The GSO Corrections Desk sends out pleas to the Fellowship for additional CCS volunteers on a regular basis, (see attachment 1). Usually in the July edition, the *Grapevine* publishes an article, usually entitled "Male Call", announcing the need for additional male Corrections Correspondent volunteers, (see attachment 2). The Corrections Desk also sends an annual letter to Delegates asking them to announce the need for additional CCS volunteers.

There has never been a pamphlet on the Corrections Correspondence Service.

Service Material publication F-26, (see attachment 3), serves as the application used to volunteer for CCS and provides some information on CCS.

Fellowship members who have served as Corrections
Correspondents have found this form of 12th Step service to be
very rewarding. Fellowship sharing on the value of CCS
participation can be found in a variety of A.A. publications such as
Box 459, the Grapevine, and the Corrections Desk publication
Sharing From Behind The Walls.

It is anticipated that more Fellowship members would volunteer for this service if current and additional Fellowship sharing on why participation is "most rewarding" could be consolidated into a pamphlet on the Corrections Correspondence Service.

Additional participation by new CCS volunteers would allow the "hand of A.A. to be there" when a still suffering alcoholic behind the bars "reaches out for help", instead of being placed on a waiting list.



NEW! Agenda Item Process Deadline and Form

Please read this important communication regarding an Advisory Action approved by the 71st G.S.C. to implement "The Equitable Distribution of Workload and Scoring Tool Process."

The Conference agreed that the new process would help ensure an equitable distribution of the Conference committees' workload.

There are two key changes that this new process implements.

- 1. The annual Proposed Agenda Item submission deadline has changed from December 15 to **September 15**. The NEW deadline for submission of proposed agenda items for the 72nd General Service Conference is September 15, 2021.
- 2. A new standardized Proposed Agenda Item Submission Form is to be completed for all proposed agenda items. The Conference noted that the new submission form will bring much needed structure and clarity to the process.

General Service Conference (G.S.C.) Proposed Agenda Item Submission Form

Annual deadline for submissions for a General Service Conference is September 15*.

What types of proposals, suggestions or ideas rise to the level of needing a General Service Conference "action" or "decision"?

Proposals that are important to the future of Alcoholics Anonymous, policy decisions or request for changes to Conference-approved literature and items that might require the collective conscience of the Fellowship. The trustees, corporate directors and staff bring together years of experience in A.A. service in making decisions about the appropriate process or disposition of proposed Conference agenda items. Warranty six reminds us "that though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government..." The A.A. Service Manual/Twelve Concepts for World Service page 72.

The A.A. Service Manual/Twelve Concepts for World Service states on page S57 that:

The final agenda for any Conference consists of items suggested by individual A.A. members, groups, delegates, trustees, area assemblies, area committee members, and directors and staff members of A.A.W.S. and the Grapevine. The Conference considers matters of policy for A.A. as a whole, and there are tried-and-true procedures for placing an item on the agenda in the most effective way — or, when the suggestion does not concern overall policy, for routing it to the most appropriate part of the service structure.

If a G.S.R. has an idea for an agenda item, chances are that he or she will want to discuss it first with the group, then at a district or area meeting, which can then forward it to the staff member at G.S.O. currently serving as Conference coordinator. An A.A. who is not part of the general service structure can give the idea to the group's G.S.R. or write directly to the Conference coordinator.

The following is from a process overview document "FAQs on Group Conscience Consideration for Proposed Conference Agenda Items."

- Q. What happens when a proposed Conference agenda item arrives at the Conference Coordinator's desk?
- A. The Conference Coordinator acknowledges receipt of the proposed agenda item and lets the sender know which of the following options is most appropriate and, if necessary, an explanation of why and how the proposed agenda item is being directed. Some of the possible routes are:
 - 1. Forwarding to a Trustees' Committee via a G.S.O. Staff Member or Department Head.
 - 2. Forwarding to G.S.O.'s Publications Director or Group Services Staff person.
 - 3. Forwarding to A.A. World Services, Inc.
 - Forwarding to Chair of the General Service Board.
 - 5. Forwarding to the A.A. Grapevine Corporate Board/AA Grapevine Publisher.
- Q. What happens when it is unclear what committee should address a proposed item or where an item should be routed?
- A. When it is unclear where a proposed item belongs, it is most frequently forwarded to the trustees' Committee on the Conference for direction.

If a proposed agenda item does not rise to the level of a Conference action the topic could be programmed during Conference in a different way like a presentation/discussion or workshop.

This overview is general and includes many but not necessarily all the possible routes a proposed agenda item follows in the trustee, G.S.O. and Grapevine review process. There is no "one size fits all" procedure and, on a case-by-case basis over time, there may occasionally be inconsistencies.



71st GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE Quick Reference

G.S.C. April 18-24, 2021

Some Advisory Actions that **PASSED**:

- The goals expressed in the 2018 Advisory Action establishing a dynamic A.A.W.S. LinkedIn page be implemented to provide current and relevant content about A.A. to professionals.
- Revisions to A.A.W.S. literature directed to members behind the walls and to replace the terms "inmate" and "offender" with "person in custody."
- The AA Grapevine Board implement an Instagram account and requested that a report on the account be brought back to the 2022 Conference Committee on Grapevine and La Viña..
- A Fifth Edition of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect current membership, keeping in mind the 1995 Advisory Action that: "The first 164 pages of the Big Book, *Alcoholics Anonymous*, the Preface, the Forewords, 'The Doctor's Opinion,' 'Dr. Bob's Nightmare,' and the Appendices remain as is,"
- Pending its development, the draft Fifth Edition of the Big Book would include a new foreword, an updated preface and updates to expand on existing ideas in Appendices III and V.
- The pamphlet "A.A. for the Black and African-American Alcoholic" be updated to include fresh stories and a new title that is both respectful and inclusive.
- A draft version of the English language big book, *Alcoholics Anonymous* (Fourth Edition), be translated into plain and simple language and be developed in a way that is accessible and relatable to as wide of an audience as possible.
- The existing version of the pamphlet "The Twelve Traditions Illustrated" not be retired.
- A Fourth Edition of the Spanish big-book, *Alcohólicos Anónimos*, be developed, including an update of stories to better reflect current membership.
- The trustees' General Service Conference Committee make use of virtual meeting technologies to develop a process for polling the General Service Conference between annual meetings, in order to enable real-time discussion and debate, broad participation, and greater efficiency than the current process.
- The Equitable Distribution of Workload Process, as detailed from 2020 trustees' GSC committee, be implemented on a three-year trial basis, with a progress report to be brought back after each year of the trial.



Revised manuscript of *The A.A. Service Manual combined with Twelve Concepts for World Service*,

2021-2023 Edition

was approved.

- The U.S./Canada General Service Structure recognize online groups and encourage their participation, listing those groups who ask to be listed within the group's preferred district and area.
- The General Service Board form a committee to explore future possibilities for the participation of online groups in the U.S./Canada General Service structure.

Floor Actions that **PASSED**:

- The pamphlet "A.A. for the Native North American" be updated to include language that is both respectful and inclusive of all Indigenous peoples as well as add fresh stories and updating inaccuracies contained in the current pamphlet.
- The Preamble revision described in the 3RD floor action of the 71st GSC as the new revised A.A. Preamble be presented to the General Service Board for approval.

3rd floor action: The first sentence of the A.A. Preamble be revised with gender-neutral language by replacing the words "men and women" with the word "people" to read:

"Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of people who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism."

What! 3 approved motions on the pre-amble?






