### DCM's, Standing Committee Chairs, Officer Reports:

#### Each Area Conference Committee:

- Corresponds to a General Service Conference (GSC) committee.
- Under the leadership of our officers, chairs and/or liaisons, will work together to become knowledgeable on the GSC agenda topics for their committee.

- Will have members representing both the North and the South, which will allow us to meet and serve with members from both ends of the state.
- Will recommend to the delegate one or more topics from their committee to be presented (however, a committee may decide not to recommend any topics).
- Will provide the presenter(s) for the topic(s) chosen by the delegate to be presented at either the roundtables or the assembly.

Q. Who can be on one of the Area Conference Committees?

A. *Participation is completely voluntary. Any member can volunteer.*

Q. Are the Area Conference Committees the same committees that go out and perform service throughout the fellowship?

A. *No, service committees are generally organized within the NAGSC and SAGSC service structures and are separate from the Area Conference Committees.*

*Example: Participation on the Area Conference Committee on Public Information does not mean a member does PI service. If public information service is attractive, a member joins the NAGSC or SAGSC PI Committee.*

Q. Can a member be on both an Area Conference Committee and a NAGSC or SAGSC service committee?

A. *Absolutely, but not required. However, it would be extremely beneficial.*

Q. What will my participation include?

A. *Participation will include a few conference calls and communication through email throughout the year. We will also get to see each other at our Area Assemblies in Tonopah, as well as at our NAGSC or SAGSC meetings. There will be other opportunities for those interested in doing more.*

I want to especially thank all who served as Area Conference Committee Chairs. You are our pioneers. You took a risk. We appreciate the time and effort you all put into learning a new process and leading those on your committees. Your feedback is invaluable and hopefully we will be able to incorporate your suggestions for next our panel. Thank you to all our past trusted servants who mentored the Area Conference Committees. We benefited from your wisdom and experience. And finally, a big shout out to all those who interpreted at our meetings and translated all the documents. This was the first panel where all the documents (or nearly all) were available to our Spanish speaking members.
